

STONECUTTERS BRIDGE – HONG KONG – CHINA



The Stonecutters Bridge is a high-level cable-stayed bridge which spans the Rambler Channel in Hong Kong, connecting Nam Wan Kok, Tsing Yi island and Stonecutters Island. The bridge deck was completed on 7 April 2009, making this the 2nd longest cable-stayed span in the world at the time of its completion. It opened to traffic on 20 December 2009. The bridge spans 1.6 km, with 3 lanes in each direction.

It is a cable-stayed bridge with two bridge towers, one on Tsing Yi Island and the other on Stonecutters Island.

Between August 2007 and June 2009 around 350 kg of **ZINGA** has been used by **Wang Tak Shipbuilding & Engineering Co.** to cover steel deck gentries and to cover weld seams for repairs and touch-ups.
